Sgt. Dionne presented Council with the May policing report.

Councillor Ikalualuq questioned if the RCMP should be responding to medical calls.

Constable Dionne stated that it's a liability issue but since there are no services in the community they've been and will continue to respond to the medical calls.

Mayor Erwin Elias thanked the RCMP for responding to the medical calls. He stated that in the past we've made comments or asked questions and was always told that it would be reported back. He stated that we haven't received updates on the comments/questions that have been asked in previous meetings. He stated that in the past the previous Sgt. was working closely with the local housing authority in regards to tenants that have a lot of RCMP calls for service to their unit. He stated that this might be a useful tool for the RCMP to use.

Constable Dionne stated that he will follow up with this concern to see why it wasn't being done.

Deputy Mayor Tyrone Raddi questioned if the RCMP can interfere with a beach party. He stated that he seen a very disturbing video of someone who was highly intoxicated, swimming in the water where there was still ice present.

Constable Dionne stated that the RCMP can do patrols on the beaches.

Councillor Shawn Lundrigan commented that it's good to see there have been four charges for bootlegging.

Constable Dionne informed Council that these are not necessarily charges, they receive a fine.

Councillor Shawn Lundrigan suggested that a community initiative be created to try and get the community to use crime stoppers.

Mayor Erwin Elias stated that we're never going to stop bootlegging and that we can't put full restrictions on our people as it will force them to start drinking other things. He stated that we can advocate for change, for funding to fill the positions needed in the community to keep our people busy. He thanked the RCMP for their services.

Mr. Whalen presented Council with a presentation on the NUNA project that the Hamlet has collaborated with Natural Resources Canada.

Mayor and Council stressed the importance of reporting back to Mayor and Council with any new changes to funding, employment opportunities for our residents.

- He stated that the Husky Lakes pullout needs a garbage bin.
Mayor Erwin Elias directed administration to contact the Department of Infrastructure regarding this and to mention that they should be considering all the other pullouts along the highway.

iv) Councillor Ryan Yakeleya raised the following statement/ concern/suggestion:

- He questioned if anything can be done about the motorbikes zooming through the community.
Mayor Erwin Elias stated that the Hamlet does have a noise bylaw. Quiet time is from 11pm to 7am. He'd like postings put out to educate the community on the bylaw and respecting your neighbours.
- He stated that signage is needed for the tourist who park at the point. He stated that they shouldn't be parking so close to the bank for safety reasons.

Mayor Erwin Elias directed administration to get signage put up at the point area.

v) Councillor Ikalualuq raised the following statement/concern/suggestion:

- He stated that the Hamlet held a community cleanup and that they didn't do a good job as there's still a lot of places left to do especially the roads going out of the community.

ASAO Katrina Cockney stated that she will review the budget and see what we can come up with.

- He questioned when the welcome to Tuk sign will be put back up.

Mayor Erwin Elias stated that this would be going through the court system and that we'd have to wait for insurance to replace the sign as the costs is over \$50K.

- He stated that there are still a lot of low lying roads in the community and wondered if there would be work done on these as well.

Mayor Erwin Elias stated that there are 22 segments of roads to complete in the community as per the Baird Engineering report.

vi) Mayor Erwin Elias raised the following statement/concern/suggestion:

- He stated that he's happy with what we do at the Hamlet but one of the things he felt bad about was the bike draws for the Spring cleanup. He'd like to donate 4 bikes to the Canada day event to be drawn for all youth ages 15 & Under. This will come out of the Mayors fund.
- He'd like a posting on the dust stop put out tomorrow.
- He stated that the Recreation department put a call out for volunteers and that it would be really good to see members of Council take part in this event.
