Sgt. McDonald reviewed the June 2021 Policing report to Council.

SAO Shawn Stuckey questioned if the RCMP have been doing patrols on the Inuvik-Tuktoyaktuk highway (ITH).

Sgt. McDonald informed Council that they have been out doing patrols when they have staff to do so.

Councillor Joe Nasogaluak informed the RCMP that there will be a baseball tournament this coming weekend and it would be great to have their presence there.

SAO Shawn Stuckey questioned if the statistics under the liquor act are relatively the same?

Sgt. McDonald stated that when officers enter the data into the system it can be related to other categories which is why some calls for services may be lower than others. He also stated that a majority of our calls are alcohol related.

Councillor Tyrone Raddi questioned if the RCMP can do patrols on the ITH when the money comes in.

Sgt. McDonald stated that the RCMP would still have to follow proper protocols while doing patrols on the ITH and that they would need probable cause to search a vehicle. He stated that the RCMP do need members of the public to call in and that members of the public should be made aware that they can remain anonymous if they wish to do so.

Councillor Joe Nasogaluak stated that we need to let our community members know that it is important that they call in this information. He stated that we have to work together to stop the alcohol from coming into our community.

SAO Shawn Stuckey stated that the municipality can hold 2 prohibitions per year if we are a restricted community and questioned when the RCMP would recommend to have this in place.

Sgt. McDonald stated that he is happy with whatever date is chosen by the Hamlet.

Councillor Ikalualuq stated that in the past Tuk was a dry community and it did work. If the Hamlet is going to look into changing this, we need to tell the community why we'd like it. He stated that the RCMP, Health Centre and social services all see first hand the effects of alcohol.

Councillor Tyrone Raddi thanked the RCMP for the great job they are doing and stated that the Hamlet will help them curb the amount of alcohol in the community.

i) Councillor Ikalualuq made the following concern/suggestion:

- He questioned where the Hamlet stands with the new solid waste site as he is worried about the NWT water board.

SAO Shawn Stuckey advised Council that the community planning committee as well as the finance committee reviewed the 5-year plan and refused to go below \$1M in the budget. He stated that the Hamlet has no funding to complete the solid waste site this year.

- He questioned when can the community use the new cemetery?

SAO Shawn Stuckey advised Council that the garage staff will be working on the cemetery but there still needs to be community consultation on when to open and when to stop using the current site.

- He stated that the radio station employee had to buy her own fan. He stated that a cooling system is needed.

Motion made by Councillor Ikalualuq and seconded by Councillor Joe Nasogaluak that Council approve the purchase of a portable air conditioner for the radio station.

- He suggested the Hamlet no longer run fishing derbies as the recent study on fish in Husky lakes was conducted and the numbers don't look good.

ii) Councillor Joe Nasogaluak made the following concern/suggestion:

- He stated that he brought this concern forward a few times and would like something done about it. He stated that it's for the safety of the community. He'd like to install markers to mark out the point where the cut bank is. He stated that we should also educate the community of the danger areas.

Chairperson Tyrone Raddi stated that if the Hamlet sends a letter to his program he may be able to assist with the signage.

- He stated that he's been on Council for years and that he gifted a carving for the governor general during the opening ceremonies of the Inuvik-Tuktoyaktuk highway and he's never seen the carving displayed.

Chairperson Tyrone Raddi would like administration to find out who owns the carving.

- He stated that he saw Arctic Chalet's tour bus in the community and that they were parked outside the icehouse. He stated that a sign needs to be put up to let people know that it is closed to the public/tourists.

Chairperson Tyrone Raddi suggested contacting the Emerging Arts Program to see if we can get some signage made through them for our Hamlet needs.

iii) Councillor Tyrone Raddi made the following concern/suggestion:

- He recommended that the Bylaw Committee review the liquor restrictions to see what can be done about the amount of alcohol coming into the community.
- He suggested that on hot days that the fire department create a splash park and also have recreation department pull out the bouncy houses.
